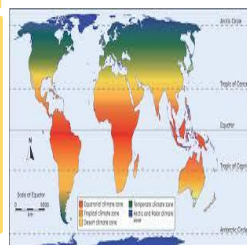
Extreme Earth - Autumn 1

The Pacific Ring of Fire is an arc around the Pacific Ocean where many volcanoes and earthquakes are formed. About three quarters of the world's dormant volcanoes and active volcanos are here.



In the Zone - Autumn 2

Climate zones are regions with similar long-term patterns of weather, like a place's typical temperature and rainfall. They are essentially areas with a distinct climate, which influences what plants and animals can live there.



Club Med - Autumn 2

Mediterranean climate is a very pleasant climate with warm, dry summers and cool, mild winters. It gets its name from the Mediterranean Sea. Most of the coastal land around the Mediterranean Sea experiences this climate.



Rivers and Coasts - Summer 2

Climate change can affect coastal areas in a variety of ways. Coasts are sensitive to sea level rise, changes in the frequency and intensity of storms, increases in precipitation, and warmer ocean temperatures. This rising acidity can have significant impacts on coastal and marine ecosystems.
