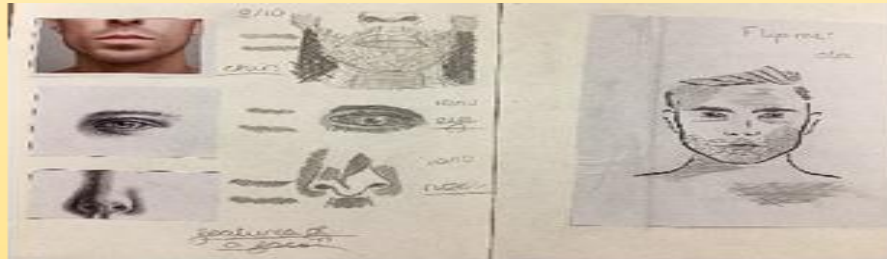




## Art

This half term, our design brief was to create a WWI scene (No Man's Land) with a range of materials.

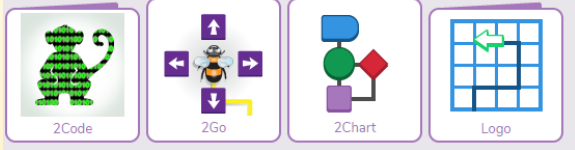
We were challenged to create a functioning model using accuracy. The purpose was to show what it was like on the front line at the war.
