## Topic Homework 2 - Due Wednesday 26<sup>th</sup> March

**Free Choice:** choose your own project related to Mountains. Surprise me with your creativity! You need to complete a short evaluation for your project (see attached), which will be stuck into your topic book.

Your work should be based on research and beautifully presented. If you are doing a written project, it must be in your own words - you cannot just copy and paste from the internet. Here are some ideas for those of you who might need them:

Find out about animals that inhabit a mountainous area of the world. How do they adapt and survive? Are any of these animals endangered? Why? Present your findings about your chosen animal in whatever way you would like.

Choose one of the major Mountains in the world and produce an informative leaflet on it, including pictures and encouraging people to visit. (Do not choose Everest or Snowdon as we will be covering these in class)

Make a model of a Mountain and label it using geographical vocabulary.

Research mountain sports such as skiing, snowboarding, rock climbing or mountain biking. Choose one that excites you and create a scrapbook/poster of information and images. Feature the equipment or clothing needed and the world's best competitors in the sport.

Do some more mountain inspired art. You could make a black and white or coloured picture; use pencils, paint, chalk or some other medium. You could also make a collage. Do some research for ideas - there is some wonderful different mountain art out there!

Design and make a mountain themed game (like Top Trumps).
