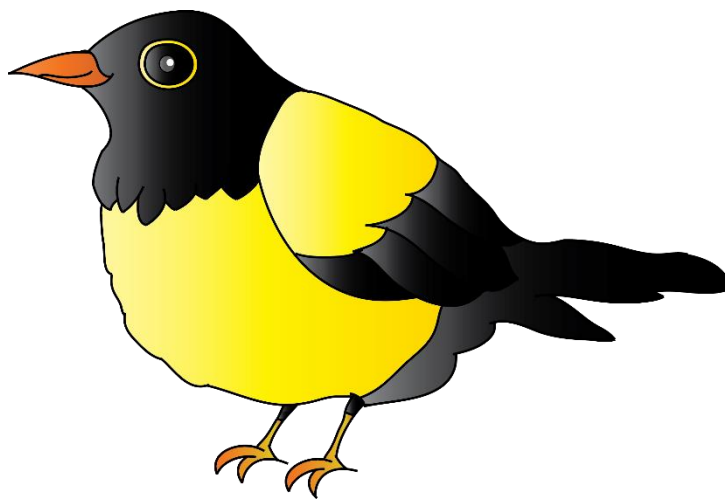

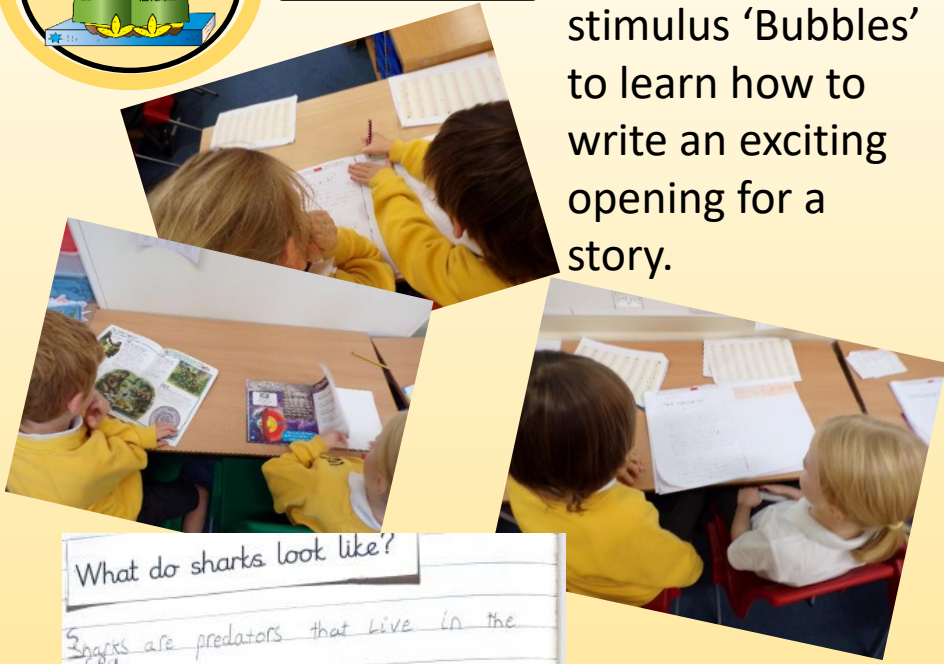

Sharks are a big type of ^{fish} shark that are normally grey, white, and blue.

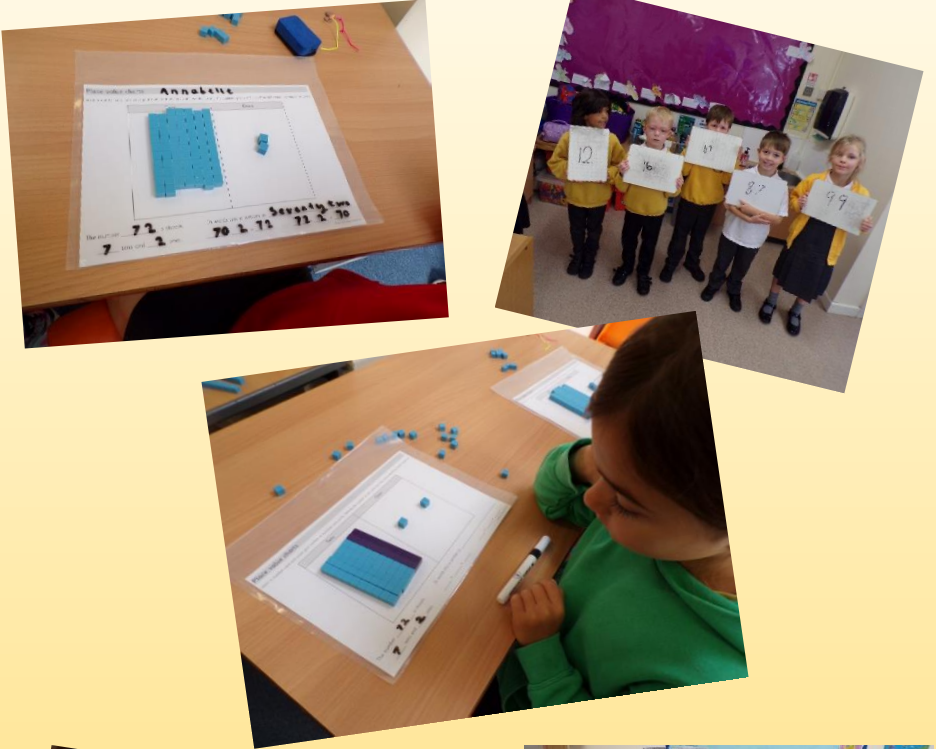
Sharks have gills so that they can breathe underwater. Some sharks have 7, 6, or 5 gills. Sharks have a tail to speedily change directions.

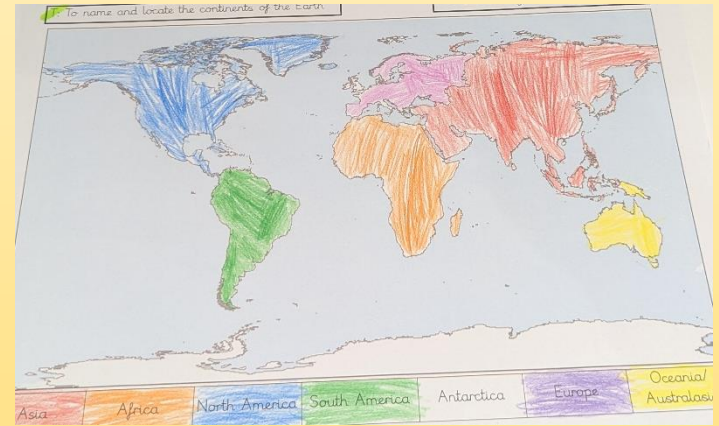
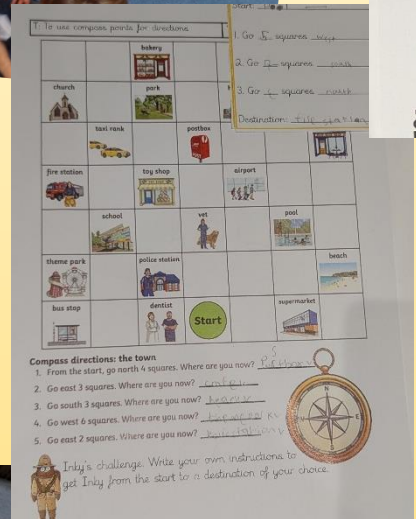
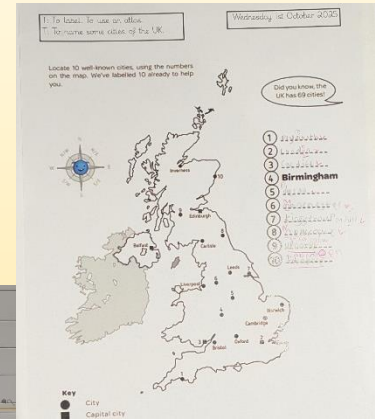
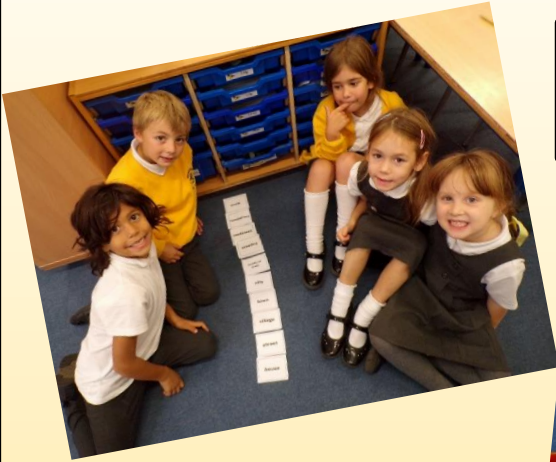


Science

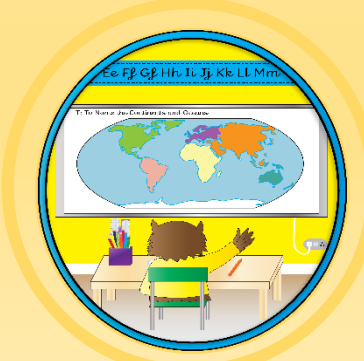

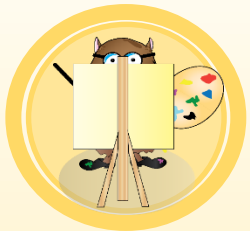


The World Around Us
